Permanent Trust Fund for Medicaid Passes First Committee

This past week, Senate Bill 88 to establish a \$2 billion permanent trust fund for Medicaid passed the Senate Health and Public Affairs Committee and is now headed to Senate Finance. **Encourage your legislators to support Senate Bill 88**!

This fund will help New Mexico significantly raise the reimbursement rates for health care providers who treat patients insured under Medicaid, which covers nearly half of all New Mexicans. Increasing those reimbursement rates will help New Mexico recruit and retain more doctors. New Mexico has a higher proportion of patients insured by Medicaid than any other state, and Medicaid often pays them less than the cost of providing treatment.
